# What is an Alpaca?

An alpaca is a domesticated species of South American camelid - similar to and often confused with the Ilama. While Ilamas are used as pack animals, alpacas are much smaller and are raised for their soft fiber.

Alpacas are gentle and curious. They can spit when distressed or feel threatened - usually at other alpacas.

Alpacas eat mostly grass and hay and have three-chambered stomachs like other ruminants.

Alpacas can breed once a year. The female alpaca has a gestation period of 242-345 days and gives birth to just one offspring. A baby alpaca is called a cria.

Alpacas live up to 20 years.
